Direct Air Capture Research At The **Clean Energy Conversions Lab**

In the push to decarbonize, it is crucial that we consider the local implications of new energy technologies. This is true for direct air capture, or DAC, a technology that the Clean Energy Conversions Lab, located within the Pennovation Works ecosystem, are studying closely. Direct Air Capture occurs when carbon dioxide is removed from the air and sent to storage.

GRASP Lab Opens New "Treehouse" Suite in Pennovation Lab Building The GRASP Treehouse officially opened in August with the New Student Orientation event for incoming ROBO students, followed by the grand opening celebration. Located in Suite 250 of the Pennovation Lab Building, the Treehouse marks GRASP's third official location within the Pennovation Works ecosystem. The suite contains lab space and benches, work desks, faculty office space, a student/collaborator conference room, and a multipurpose room. Read more.

Expansion and Improvements

In 2023, work began on an infrastructure replacement project, upgrading and modernizing Pennovation Works to support the near and long-term development goals of the site. Utility services will be placed within the main corridor, creating a utility "loop,' and a new electrical substation will be essential as the facilities continue to grow.

Progress continued on the Life Sciences research, development and manufacturing facility, with the project advancing through design development. The phased 484,000 sq. ft. stateof-the-art life science building is designed for multiple uses, and will feature a single story biomanufacturing facility, and two five-story towers featuring lab and office space.







Community Collaborations

In 2023, the spirit of collaboration and community at Pennovation Works continued to thrive, which solidified partnerships with the city, University, and local neighborhood. These relationships provided an opportunity to host local community events at the Center.



Grays Ferry Tree Tenders

Pennovation Works partnered with the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society's Tree Tenders program once again this year. Pennovation members, staff, and local volunteers planted over a dozen trees throughout the surrounding Grays Ferry neighborhood, and measured previously planted trees to monitor their growth and health.



Women in Bio Event Pennovation Works member company, Interius **Biotherapeutics**, co-hosted the Women in Bio event at the Pennovation Center. Pennovation was thrilled to host this evening of networking and showcase how this organization promotes careers, leadership, and entrepreneurship for all women in the life sciences field.



FemmeHacks

The 9th annual two-day collegiate hackathon was held at the Pennovation Center again this year. FemmeHacks is powered by the University of Pennsylvania's Women in **Computer Science chapter** and made to empower, educate, and inspire women and non-binary folks.
